

**Flooding/Drainage Information from Oak Hills Lake Development Association from President, Rob McConnell, Ruth Kovacs, and other Lake Residents:**

Around May 19, 2021, several Oak Hills Place residents on the lake and other resident's homes within the Greater Oak Hills Neighborhood and Iberville Terrace neighborhoods were flooded. The flooding was the result of our street storm drains not being able to handle the amount of rainwater within a short period of time – not from the lake overflowing.

This is the dept. to contact for storm drain maintenance, if we can get some requests put in around the lake and even the Greater Oak Hills Neighborhood, we may fare better the next time we get a big rain event.

- The Vactor truck is that big bottle truck with the vacuum hose. You can request they come clean out your storm drains.
- They give priority to people whose homes or cars have flooded.
- The lady in Maintenance said you first need to **call 311** to put in a Work Order to have Maintenance check your storm drain.
- The direct number **IF 311 doesn't pick up** is: **225 389-3090**, and hit 9 when prompted.
- The operator will give you a Work Order number.
- If you give them an email they will contact you along the process.

## **MAINTENANCE**

The Department of Maintenance oversees drainage and landscaping on public land in East Baton Rouge Parish. Their duties include ditch digging, canal inspection and debris removal, grass mowing, litter cleanup, and pothole patching. They are also responsible for applying sand during icy conditions and removing hazardous and non-hazardous waste spills.

### **LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE**

The Landscape Maintenance division is responsible for beautifying city-owned landscapes and oversight of grass maintenance functions involving litter crew pick-up, weed-eating, and spraying crews combining efforts to give boulevards and right-of-ways a manicured appearance. This division oversees contracts for landscape maintenance for boulevards, public building sites and FEMA lots.

### **STREET MAINTENANCE**

The Street Maintenance division is responsible for maintaining roadways by repairing potholes, street blowouts, and curbs. They are responsible for applying sand during icy conditions and removing hazardous and non-hazardous waste spills.

### **DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE**

**The Drainage Maintenance division is responsible for roadside ditch digging and off-road canal excavation, canal debris removal, inspections of roadside ditches and canals, vector truck operations, storm-drain and catch-basin concrete repair work, erosion remediation, and surveying land for property lines.**
