- 4) If you are aware of an elderly neighbor please check on them before and after the hurricane.

I & other members have attended many meetings with the city about the flooding that occurred on May 17, 2021, the drainage, the continued building and the stormwater master planning.

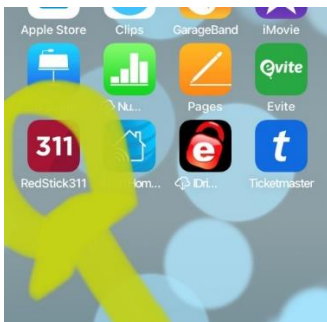
